## About this application

This is for a solicitor or registered European lawyer (REL) who wish to exercise their right to represent clients as a criminal or a civil advocate, or both, in higher courts in England and Wales. <u>See full guidance and details about the scheme. You will need to have already completed and passed the advocacy assessment(s) to apply. You will need to upload a copy of your certificate(s) as part of your application.

If you are a REL and EU/EEA or Swiss national who has qualified in an EU jurisdiction, you meet the requirements of <u>Directive 2005/36</u> (<u>Recognition of Professional Qualifications</u>) [<u>https://eur-lex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/?uri=celex%3A32005L0036</u>] and are eligible to apply under Regulation 9.10(a). You will need to <u>contact us</u> [<u>https://consultations.sra.org.uk/contactus</u>] to apply. As part of the application, you will also need to complete an <u>Assessment Table</u>
